



✓ Experimental Archaeology Collection

The Experimental Archaeology Collection is an online place for sharing and preserving data and results of experimental archaeology. **The collection (with 11,000 titles) is supported by EXARC and hosted by the Digital Archaeological Record (tDAR).** Originally created by EXARC this is a great resource for students and researchers alike.

✓ Projects

EXARC supports its membership by organising small-scale collaborations and international partnerships, often with the help of significant European Union grants. **Our projects raise the profile of the participants and allow other members to benefit from their experience.** Former projects included archaeo-crafts, experimental archaeology and archaeological open-air museums.

The results of these cooperation projects have been shared in a range of articles, film material, books and handbooks, much of which is published on our website.
